

Up until the 1880s Wayne was just a small farming village with less than 800 people. Around the mid-1880s a group of business owners got together and formed a civic group with the goal of attracting a factory of some kind to town. The Prouty and Glass Carriage company had been established in Detroit just a few years before, but were already outgrowing their space, so in 1888 they were given free land along the railroad in Wayne to build a new factory. Prouty and Glass Carriages were highly respected, and they became one of the largest producers of carriages and sleighs in the country. The carriage company employed hundreds of townspeople, who worked as wood carvers, blacksmiths and wheel makers. The employees by all accounts loved working there, as the company would have excursions for picnics and concerts, dances, and even had an employee brass band. By the mid-teens automobiles were coming onto the scene though and sales of carriages declined. In 1916 Prouty and Glass went out of business, and the buildings and tools were sold to a new car manufacturer, Harroun.

Object Spotlight – Cigar Boxes

-Did you know Wayne used to grow tobacco and even had a few small cigar manufacturers? Its likely that formerly enslaved people heading north brought the knowledge and techniques of tobacco growing up from the south after the civil war. Tobacco grows well in the Michigan summers, but competition from larger companies ended the practice by the 1930s. Local cigar maker Erastus "Rat" Coy called his cigars "The Rattler".
