

The Hosie House



The home, formerly at 64646 Main Street, was built between 1904-1905 by James and Clara Hosie. James amassed his fortune through his many business interests and eventually the couple built this large classical revival house on the site of their old home.

From 1928-1958, the home was occupied by up to 14 nuns at a time who taught at nearby St. Mary's School.



After a new convent was built, the home sat vacant for a few years until 1966 when it was demolished for Urban Renewal.

The home was considered one of Wayne's first mansions.



The Hosies raised two daughters here, and when Mr. Hosie died in 1928 Clara sold the home to St. Mary's Church to become a convent.
