

## Wayne Doctors




Wayne had a resident doctor, Mr. Julius Hume, as early as 1832. Most doctors and dentists of the time were travelers who often went town to town, operating out of hotel rooms a few days a month. Medicines and tonics prescribed could be bought at William Steers General Store.



In the later 19th century doctors made house calls, treating sick or injured people in their own homes. Ira Fletcher was a doctor in Wayne during this time, from 1875-1883.



Richard P. Parr was an early Wayne dentist from 1883-1931. He took over for his father, George D. Parr, who was Wayne's first dentist.



Thomas Morrison was one of the early town doctors from 1863-1875. He then transitioned into running a grocery store and pharmacy until 1893.



Samuel Zimmerman was a physician from 1891-1928, and he ran his own pharmacy until 1908.



Jesee Cady M.D. was in Wayne from 1885-1893. About this time, more doctors began to have college degrees and then in the 1920s, many opened their own offices or small hospitals.
