The Historical Museum




In 1878 the Wayne Village Hall was built to a design by James Lewis of Detroit. It was built in the Second Empire Style, which is a French eclectic style of architecture that is known for its mansard roof, like the one on the museum. The village hall was the main square part of the museum with an upstairs, and no basement yet. The city official's offices were upstairs on the second floor. The basement, along with the jail cells was added in the 1920's when the building was turned from a village hall into the police and fire department. Also, an addition was added to the rear and side to house two fire engines. As the years went by, the police and fire department moved out into their own buildings. In 1965 the building opened as a Museum. During Urban Renewal in the 1960's, the two cannons dating from 1865 were moved to the front lawn of the Museum, and the big green urn was added, which was originally a horse watering trough. In 1986 two additions were added and the Museum was added to the Michigan Historic Building Register. There are numerous artifacts and displays in the Museum that we are always working on. We have a brand new display of quilts made in Wayne by talented women which will be on display for the rest of the year. The Museum is open on Wednesdays and Thursdays 10 am to 6pm.
