Historic General Store Found!




Barnards Variety Store before it was moved

In the 1870s the Barnard variety store sat on an awkward triangle of land at the intersection of Monroe, Biddle and Norris street. In 1877 Henry Barnard, a Civil War Veteran, and his wife Olive opened a book and stationary store in this building. The business grew to include confectionaries, stationary and evolved into a variety and gift store, similar to Leos. In 1907 Wayne was getting electricity and a spot in the center of town was desired for the substation. Barnards store was moved from its old location to 35457 Brush Street and turned into a house. The museum has been doing a series on Facebook about houses that were moved and some of the oldest houses, and we traced this one down. The house is now sideways on the lot, with the above pictured original front now facing East to the house next door. You just never know where pieces of Wayne history have moved off to.


Gift Ideas!

The Museum moves into the 21st century

The museum recently purchased a new digital cataloging software called Catalogit, which will allow us to digitize and make searchable all of our photos, documents and objects. The great thing is that it is hosted on servers far away, so if our computers go down the info won't be lost, and because of this we can also make it searchable and accessible from your home. Soon we will have a link up to our database and anyone from anywhere in the world can search our stuff for free. At the moment we only have about 200 pictures entered and can only add about 100 per day, so this will be an ongoing process. We've been digitizing pictures, slides, negatives and VHS tapes since November and have over 10,000 images scanned so far.
